Corporate objectives

We have agreed four strategic pillars each with its own objectives, deliverables and KPIs.

- Voice and visibility to ensure that CIEH is recognised as the voice of the profession by its members, stakeholders, key decision makers and the public
- **Membership** to maintain our current membership base while increasing the number and variety of environmental health professionals joining CIEH
- Professional development to develop a professional development framework and assets that set the standards for professionalism in environmental health
- **Enablement** to provide the best infrastructure, resources and governance to enable CIEH to improve the delivery of products and services to members

Activities to date

- Voice and visibility
 - Carried out stakeholder mapping exercise and agreed external affairs strategy
- Membership
 - Commissioned independent market research agency to survey the opinions of members and non-members across all three sectors.
- Professional development
 - Delivered a new professional standards framework
 - Closed our Awarding Organisation function and replaced vocational qualifications with new work based learning delivered as a chartered body
- Enablement
 - Modernised the governance structure with a single, unitary board, universal suffrage and new supporting advisory groups.
 - Reduced our headcount by 50% with cost savings of over £2m.

2018 activities

Focus this year is on modernising our membership offer, delivering campaigns that get our voice heard and completely re-building our learning pathways from apprenticeships to chartered status.
