- 3. Engage with communities; urban, rural and remote to assist in improving environmental health outcomes and participate in the development and implementation of projects and promotion activities.
- 4. Monitor, record and report on all environmental health activities in accordance with Departmental policy and procedure.
- 5. Assist Environmental Health practitioners, including Aboriginal Environmental Health Workers and Environmental Health Students in the development of their skills and duties.
- 6. Travel to remote sites by air/road, and work outside normal office hours on weekends and public holidays as required.
- 7. Follow defined service quality standards, Work Health and Safety (WHS) policies and procedures relating to the work being undertaken in order to ensure high quality, safe services and workplaces
